intensive in Prague and works with the online dialect resource, AccentHelp.com.





DIRECTOR'S **NOTES: Playhouse Creatures** summons from the late 1660s four real, historical, extraordinary actresses, who were among the first women to perform on the English stage during the Restoration. This is a play about the past. The ghosts of our ancestors, the memories that places and buildings keep, the memories of parents, past relationships, past glories, and past trauma. This is a play about the triumphs, trials and tribulations of five strong, determined women who were there in the beginning of something new. This play is also a brutally honest love letter to the women (and men) who make theatre happen. And while there is great humor and some wonderful, ridiculous comedic moments in the play, there is always a rigorous honesty that these five women live in a world where many are just one paycheck, one fire, one untimely death, one catastrophe away from losing everything they hold dear. But they persist. They persevere.

Meet the playwirght



April De Angelis iis an acclaimed playwright who has worked in stage, radio and television. She is known for her powerful exploration of feminist themes and women's lives. Originally trained as an actress, her acclaimed plays, such as "Playhouse Creatures" (1993) and "Jumpy" (2011), blend sharp wit with deep emotional insight. A two-time finalist for the Susan Smith Blackburn playwrighting prize, among other recognitions, she is also

recognised for her adaptations, including the stage version of Elena Ferrante's *My Brilliant Friend*. Her work remains a significant force in contemporary British theatre. Television includes *Aristophanes* (Channel 4) and she has written extensively for radio, including the acclaimed adaptation of *Peyton Place* (BBC Radio, 2002). April is currently writing the book of a musical based on the film, *Saving Grace*.
